did not attend the meeting.

At the outset, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor welcomed the new  
members who were attending meeting for the first time and  
desired to use their wisdom and seek their cooperation in the  
development of the University.

The meeting of the Board of Management was earlier scheduled on 17th October, 1994 which has to be postponed because of indisposition of the Chairman and therefore the Chairman apologised to the members for the inconvenience caused to them.

The first issue of RAU News - A News letter of Rajasthan Agricultural University, Bikaner - January to October, 1994 was presented by the Chairman to the house, which was a draft for official use only and to receive suggestions for improving. The final official release will also be having some coloured photographs and is proposed to be released early before DEEWALI.

He highlighted some of the important events since holding of the last meeting of Board of Management as follows:

I. Strategic Development Plan (SDP) for the University:

Government of Rajasthan and Rajasthan Agricultural University has signed a contract with Consortium for International Development (CID) for the preparation of Strategic Development Plan for RAU on October 10, 1994 at Jaipur. The consultants will complete the work within 40 weeks with the deployment of eminent scientists equivalent to 35 man months covering all conceivable areas of RAU which require modernisation to make this infant University a Center of Excellence to meet the challenges in near future and in the beginning of the 21st Century. The University is likely to receive Rs.47.70 Crore for modernisation of plan through the World Bank.



## II. Buildings programme:

The campus development at Beechwal was going at fairly slow speed in the recent past. The building activity was reviewed and necessary instructions were given to all the agencies to gearup the work and programme of construction is getting momentum. Some of the buildings are likely to be handed over to various colleges and offices within 6 months' time to take possession and start functioning in the newly constructed buildings.

## III. Establishment of Liaison Office Cum Communication Centre at Jaipur:

The University receives most of the grants from the State Government and therefore a persistent follow-up and sustained pursuation is required to get the approval/sanction of the Government from time to time. In absence of any Liaison Officer at Jaipur most of the things got delayed and work suffered and therefore an urgent need to establish Liaison Office was felt. The University could manage to get a room allotted at Pant Krishi Bhavan, Jaipur to establish the office which will facilitate the work of the University. Through this facility University would like to extend to people, the technology developed by its research units.

## IV. Meeting of the Post-graduate Council:

The meeting of the Post-graduate Council was held at Bikaner on June 25, 1994 which approved the newly formulated courses of different Faculties of the University.

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V. Peer Assessment of RAU:

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On approval of the Board of Management, a High-Powered External Review Committee (ERC) of 11 eminent scientists has been constituted under the Chairmanship of Dr.J.S.Kanwar, Former Deputy Director General, ICRISAT, Hyderabad. All members except Dr.R.P. Aneja who has left for a foreign assignment have given their acceptance. He will be substituted by an eminent Dairyman. The Committee would critically examine the ongoing activities and suggest remedial measures. All the 3 activities namely teaching, research and extension alongwith governance will be covered.

VI. Bifurcation of Assets:

The issue of bifurcation of the assets between the erstwhile Mohan Lal Sukhadia University and Rajasthan Agricultural University has been pending for more than 6 years and it is hampering the development of University at Bikaner and so also its working could give expected returns to the Society. It is a matter of serious concern and while presenting information about this, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor presented the historical perspective and how the work culture has degenerated in the Society in general and within the University in particular. Through this forum he wanted to let the Government know about the urgency of the issue and to settle the matter expeditiously. He suggested that the source of the funding of various activities should be taken as a sole criteria in deciding the bifurcation issue.



VII. Wonder Wheat RAJ 3077 from RAU:

While appreciating the efforts made by the scientists of RAU, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the house that Wheat variety Raj 3077 has shown a universal and wider adaptability, wider diverse ecological, soil and irrigation environment in North Western Zone of the country and therefore he will not hesitate to call it " WONDER WHEAT FROM RAU". He used this forum to congratulate the concerned scientists and appreciated the work of the University in this regard. The new member Sh. Surendrapal Singh, Progressive Farmer also joined hands to appreciate the efforts made by the Scientists of the University.

Sh. Surendrapal Singh posed some of the problems with the availability of inputs specially sale of spurious pesticides by dealers. The matter was discussed at length. APS suggested that supply of inputs should be channelised through Cooperative Sector.

VIII. New Research Projects/Facilities:

Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the house about new research projects and the projects in pipeline which certainly indicate the direction of work which is considered to be very logical. The new projects as well as Research Projects in pipeline are the outcome of the efforts made by the concerned Scientists and the University administration would go a long way in contributing to Agricultural Development of the State. These projects are listed below:

- i) AICRP on post-harvest technology of horticultural crops.
- ii) Management of Brown Wheat Mite, *Petrobia latens* (Mullar) in Rajasthan.
- iii) Energy Balance of Farm Women in Relation to Their Nutrition Status.

- iv) Plasticulture Development Centre.
- v) ~~Embryo Biotechnology in Cattle.~~
- vi) ~~Drainage and Water Management for Salinity Control in Canal Commands- An Indo-Dutch Project.~~
- vii) Biotechnology Research Centre (Agriculture).
- viii) Augmenting Soybean Production for Improving Protein and Oil Situation in Rajasthan.
- ix) Improvement of Tharparkar Breed of Cattle through associated Herd Progeny Testing.
- x) Technology, Scale of Productin, Quality, Shelf-life, Packaging, Marketing and Consumer Behaviour of Indigenous Dairy Products of Rajasthan.

#### IX. National Rabi Pulses Group Meet:

A four days National Rabi Pulse Group Meet was held at Bikaner from September 15 to 18, 1994. The meet was attended by more than 200 Scientists from all over the country. The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor while informing the house brought out that the organization and conduct of Workshop has been appreciated by one and all including ICAR- the sponsors of the Group Meet. One of the significant event was the identification of 7 yielding varieties out of which one Chickpea variety, GNG 663 developed by the RAU has been found suitable for North-West plain zone of the country. The variety has a yield potential of 24 q ha<sup>-1</sup>. It is expected that it will be adopted at fast speed in Ganganagar district in particular and North-West plain zone in general. This is likely to add a feather in the cap of the University and the concerned scientists.

#### X. IFL and certified Seeds:

Ever since the zonal concept has been adopted by the University, the efforts and technology have been developed keeping in view the location specific problems. Inspite of best efforts made in developing the new technology the adoption rate



by farmer is considered comparatively low by all standards. The University has now decided to multiply TFL and certified seeds and sell it under its brand name for the sale purpose to popularise varieties so that demand in the field can generate and can be subsequently met out by private as well as semi-government agencies. This will have a multiplier and scale effect to popularise varieties released by the University.

XI. Coming events:

Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the house about some of the prestigious events likely to be held under the banner of RAU which include Zonal symposium on Balanced Fertiliser use and Food Grain Production in Western States; NARP Regional Group Meeting and Global Conference on Advances in Research on Plant Diseases and their management.

All the members appreciated the launching of RAU News letter and suggested that if possible it should be published in Hindi also for the benefit of farming community. The Chairman agreed to explore the possibility and funds for this purpose.

After highlighting the achievements, the regular agenda items of the Meeting were taken up.

AU/BOM-31/94-2/535 Reporting various orders passed by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor.

The various orders passed by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor included in the agenda were noted. The Members desired that routine orders need not to be reported in the Board of Management in future. However, orders issued with regard to appointments of Deans and Directors be continued to be reported.

AU/BOM-31/94-2/536 Reporting Govt. order No.P.1(1)Vit/Rale-1/94 dated 19.7.94 transferring Sh.B.S.Joshi from this University and posting Sh.K.S.Bika as Comptroller in his place in this University.

The Board noted the above order.

AU/BOM-31/94-2/537 Considering grant of deputation leave for more than 15 days to the teachers for participation in Refresher Course/Training.

Resolved that the orders of the Vice-Chancellor granting deputation leave to Sh.Sanjeev Agarwal, Sh.R.S. Saini and Dr.Pran Mehrotra for attending Refresher Course (Bio-Science) from 26.9.94 to 15.10.94 at Delhi University be confirmed.

Considering the request of Ms.Anita Saroha, Assistant Professor, Deptt.of Extension Education, College of Home Sc.,Udaipur for granting Extra-Ordinary Leave of three years to serve as Home Economics Teacher in Botswana.

In view of the recommendation of the Dean, College of Home Sc., Udaipur and from Educational Consultant of India, (a Govt. of India enterprise) and to develop healthy relationship and extend help from a relatively more developed country like India to Botswana, a less developed country and keeping in view the current policy of the Govt. of India, the Board resolved as follows:

"Resolved that Ms.Anita Saroha, Asstt.Professor, Department of Extension Education, College of Home Science, Udaipur be granted Extra Ordinary Leave for 3 years to serve as Home Economics Teacher in Botswana as a special case. However, this will not form a precedent in future".

Considering to allow the Deepawali break for a period of 6 days to the non-teaching staff of the University.

After discussing this issue at length the Board resolved that in case if all other Universities of Rajasthan (except J.N.Vyas University, Jodhpur) observe Deepawali break for their non-teaching and teaching staff, Rajasthan Agricultural University may also observe forthcoming Deepawali break up to a maximum of six days.

Further the matter will be re-examined in view of SDP(ADP) Project report, modification and revision in Act; Statutes and Ordinance of Rajasthan Agricultural University; and as per Model Act of ICAR and also rules prevailing in neighbouring SAUs on this subject.

Resolved that provisions under Rajasthan Employment of Physically Handicapped Rules, 1976, as notified by Government of Rajasthan vide No.F.5(73)/DOP/A-2/84 dated 26.10.87 may also be adopted in this University.

Considering the qualification corrected/amended for non-teaching category posts.

Noted the qualifacations corrected/amended for the posts of non-teaching category and resolved that if the qualifications prescribed for the posts as per the enclosed statements (Appendix-I) are in consonance wih the qualifications prescribed for similar posts in the State Government, the same may be approved. However, as regard to the new qualifications for the Computer Programmer etc., the latest qualifications prescribed by the Director of Computer Science, Govt. of Rajasthan are endorsed.

Considering the request of Shri Ganga Ram, Ploughmen, ARS, Ganganagar to grant him special leave/disability leave from 12.8.92. to 25.4.93 (257 days) duly forwarded by the Director Research since he met with an electric accident on 12th August, 1992.



Resolved that Shri Ganga Ram, Ploughmen, ARS, Ganganagar be granted hospital leave from 12.8.92 to 25.4.93. The error pointed out by Shri C.S. Rajan, APS in the last line of the second para of the explanatory note of this item, mentioning that the limit mentioned in this rule may be increased by 257 days as a special case be corrected as 77 days.

AU/BOM-31/94-2/543 : Considering the criteria with regard to determining the district-wise seniority in respect of Casual Labours.

Resolved that on the basis of the opinion received from the University Advocate, tentative lists of the casual labours be circulated alongwith the criteria of determining seniority and objections be invited and there-after final seniority list be prepared and circulated.

AU/BOM-31/94-2/544 : Considering the amendment in Statute 12 of the Rajasthan Agricultural University, Bikaner, Act 1987 as recommended in the Vice-Chancellors' Co-ordination Committee Meeting held on 25.7.1994 vide resolution No. 3 (B.New Agenda items).

Resolved that the matter may be moved to the State Government for making necessary amendments in the Statute 12 of RAU Act 1987 regarding filling up 50% posts of Deputy Registrars and Additional Registrars by way of promotion from amongst the Asstt. Registrars appointed through open selections.

AU/BOM-31/94-2/545 : Considering action taken on the report submitted by the QRT to ICAR on the functioning of KVKs operating under Rajasthan Agricultural University, Bikaner & also the Status Report on the working of KVK at Fatehpur.



The Director Extension Education Dr. S.L. Intodia presented the compliance report in respect of observations made and the issues raised by the QRT members during their visit to all KVKs functioning in the State. While presenting the action taken report, the Director highlighted the salient drastic improvement emerged in the recent past in functioning of the KVKs. With the special efforts of the State Government and intervention of Sh.M.L.Mehta, Chief Secretary, GOR, the land for all the KVKs had been allotted. The members put on record the appreciation for the timely assistance provided by the Chief Secretary for establishment of the University KVKs. Non-availability of land was the greatest bottleneck in the establishment of KVKs and this was the major issue raised by the QRT also. Since, the land to all the KVKs is now available, the building construction work would now be taken up in next couple of days, since the required formalities have already been completed by Estate Officer. The building plan of all the KVK has been approved and sanction issued by the ICAR. Thereafter Director Extension Education assisted by Dr.K.D.Sharma, Chief Scientist-cum-Head, presented the Status Report of KVK, Fatehpur (Sikar) in detail including the action plan for the year 1994-95 in respect to all the four functions of the KVKs. Dr.A.N.Shukla, ADG(KVK), ICAR clarified the various issues raised by the members of the house in terms of staffing and funding pattern, infrastructural facilities, inbuilt system of evaluation, linkages with other agencies and flexibility of placement of discipline-wise staff based on the lead functions of Agro-climatic zones. Sh.C.S.Rajan, APS emphasised restructuring of the staffing pattern in the light of the revised pattern of funding of the ICAR for the three new KVKs namely Rajsamand, Dausa and Baran. The revised funding pattern imposed by the ICAR would not be acceptable by the State Government for



Rajsamand, Dausa and Baran. The revised funding pattern imposed by the ICAR would not be acceptable by the State Government for old KVK as no such condition was stipulated in the MOU signed by the University and the ICAR.

Sh.C.S.Rajan further suggested that to have better interaction and effective liaison qualified and experienced staff could be taken on deputation from the department of Agriculture, GOR in KVKs. This matter be reviewed by the University. He further emphasised that the resources should be judiciously allocated to take advantage of funding available from the ICAR and ADP.

Sh.Rajan also suggested that functioning of KVKs be assessed and evaluated by a group consisting of Director, Ext. Education, Director Agriculture and Director Horticulture and work out modalities for effective working of KVK and better linkages with the department. The group may meet and give its report for presentation in next meeting of BOM. The Director, Extension Education, Rajasthan Agricultural University would act as Chairman of this committee and should take up the matter on top-priority.

AU/BOM-31/94-2/546      Considering a paper on Research highlights of Zone-I-b (ARS,Sriganganagar) together with list of research publications published on the basis of research findings received from Director Research, Rajasthan Agricultural University, Bikaner.

Director Reserch presented highlights of the research and informed the house about recently identified/notified varieties of RAU namely Raj 3765 (Wheat), GNG 663 (Gram) and Raj Moth 40, submission of research projects on Bio-technology, Soyabean and Indo-Dutch project on drainage and water management. He also



informed about taking up of truthfully labelled seed production programme by the University. He was assisted by Dr. Ramdev, ~~Associate Director Research, ARS, Sri Ganganagar in presenting the~~ activities of irrigated North Western plan Zone I-B. The lead functions of the Zone are cotton, sugarbeet, chickpea (irrigated), sunflower, water and soil management, crop physiology, fruit research and biological control of insect pest and diseases. He presented information with respect to various trials undertaken and achievements made by the station Cotton variety RST-9 which is a hirsutum cotton variety maturing in 180-190 days with 4-6 monopodial and rest sympodial branches has brought revolution in cotton growing area's not only of Ganganagar district but also in the adjoining states of Haryana and Punjab. The variety having highest ginning percentage (36%), recorded 22.5 per cent higher yield than Bikaneri Narma and 27.2% over Ganganagar Ageti during 5 Years of testing. The Board recorded that the variety has certainly brought laurence to the scientists of the university.

Wheat Raj 3077 can be named as wonder wheat which has also been identified for salt effected soils. The variety is superior in respect of grains and disease resistance over existing checks. The newly released variety of gram GNG 663 was identified in the Rabi Pulses group meeting held at RAU, Bikaner in Sept., 1994. The variety is superior in respect of yield and disease reaction and is fit for irrigated conditions. We have been informed that the variety knows no boundries and has spread not only in Rajasthan but in Punjab, Haryana and U.P. as well.

Work on integrated nutrient management can be considered as integrated approach to help increasing the yield & at the same time to maintain fertility level of soil as well as improving the



health of the soil. The cost-benefit ratio in terms of integrated ~~nutrient management has been worked out which indicated that the~~ practice will be adopted by the farmers.

The work on irrigation management has been going on for the last 5 years. The irrigation schedule for the crops of the zone have been recommended by the station and is likely to be adopted by the farmers which will save water and reduce the cost of irrigation.

The work on weed management was initiated under the second phase of NARP. The crop selected are kinoo and sweet oranges. Objective of the study are nutritional requirement and control of insects. The work is in progress.

After the presentation Hon'ble Vice Chancellor informed the house that he visited the station some time back and saw good work being done at this station. He appreciated the work of Dr. R.P. Bharadwaj, Cotton breeder who takes keen interest not only in research but also in extension and is very well known to the farmers of the area. Sh. Surendra Pal Singh, Progressive farmer from Ganganagar and Hon'ble member of the Board of Management joined, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor in appreciating the work of the station and suggested that it should be further strengthened to serve the farmers of zone I-B.

The Board confirmed the orders passed by the Vice-Chancellor.

ANY OTHER ITEM WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIR

The matter of holding regular selections on the vacant positions was discussed at the instance of APS. The Chairman informed that the matter of reservation for the backward classes and exemption from NET examination are to be resolved first. He told that matter of reservation of OBC for making necessary provision in the Act has already been referred to the Govt. as desired by Secretary, Higher Education but no decision has been conveyed as yet. He further said regular selection could not take place since 1991 and the posts are lying vacant. APS told that since Govt. of Rajasthan has notified reservation for OBC on 28th Sept., 1993, posts lying vacant prior to this can be filled up without reservation of OBC. The APS was also of the view that reservation can not be implemented from retrospective effect.

As regards exemption from NET (National Eligibility Test) the Chairman informed the house that the matter has been referred to the State Govt. on the following grounds :-

- 1) The Selection for the post of Asstt. Professors are not held after 1989 in RAU.
- 2) In many Agricultural Universities like HAU, University of Agriculture Science, Dharward, NET is not considered as an essential requirement for the selections.
- 3) The NET qualified candidates are negligible in this university.
- 4) The NET is not conducted frequently in the faculty of Agriculture neither by ASRB nor by the State.
- 5) Many employees of the university have crossed the upper age limit i.e. 35 years and they are not eligible to appear in the NET examination.
- 6) In the Vice-Chancellors conference of the State Agricultural Universities held on 29th April, 1994 at Delhi it was decided that the requirement of NET qualification is compulsory for the post advertised now onwards and in case candidates with NET qualification are not available, the universities may follow their own procedure.



On this APS informed about the view taken by the State Govt. in this matter. He said that the NET shall be applicable in RAU from the date the NET examinations are being conducted by ASRB. The State Govt. do not want to dilute the issue. Concluding the discussions the Chairman informed that he would prefer to conduct the interviews for the post of Assoc. Professors under Carrier Advancement Scheme and thereafter the process of regular selection for the post of Deans, Directors, Professors, Assoc. Professors and Asstt. Professor shall be taken up. APS suggested that selection of Professors/Assoc.Professors can be taken up first because there is no obstacle of NET and action plan for filling up the vacancy should be chalked out.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
